DISCLOSURE OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST – Cardiovascular Imaging Asia (CIA)

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST FOR ALL AUTHORS MUST BE STATED IN THE MANUSCRIPT. A conflict of interest can exist when an author has financial or personal relationships or affiliations that could influence the author's decisions, work, or contribution to the manuscript. CIA requires complete disclosure of all relevant financial relationships and potential financial conflicts of interest. The disclosure form is the same as the ICMJE Uniform Disclosure Form for Potential Conflicts of Interest (http://www.icmje.org/coi_disclosure.pdf).

All sources of funding should be declared in the acknowledgments section of the manuscript. At the time of manuscript acceptance, CIA asks that all authors confirm and update their online disclosure statements. At the time of publication, the completed disclosure statements become available for readers to view at <http://www.asci-cia.org> or <http://www.e-cia.org>. If an author's disclosure of potential conflicts of interest is determined to be inaccurate or incomplete after publication, a correction will be published to rectify the original published disclosure statement, and additional action will be taken as necessary.

Author(s) acknowledge CIA's conflict of interest policy requirement to avoid direct and indirect conflicts of interest and, accordingly, agree to promptly inform the editor or editor's designee of any business, commercial, or other proprietary support, relationships, or interests that relate directly or indirectly to the subject of the work. Each author must complete a disclosure statement listing any business, commercial, or other proprietary support, relationships, or interests that relate directly or indirectly to the subject of the work.
